Lolland International School is committed to ensuring that all children feel safe, secure and happy so that they can grow, learn and be challenged in an environment which encourages the development of the whole child.

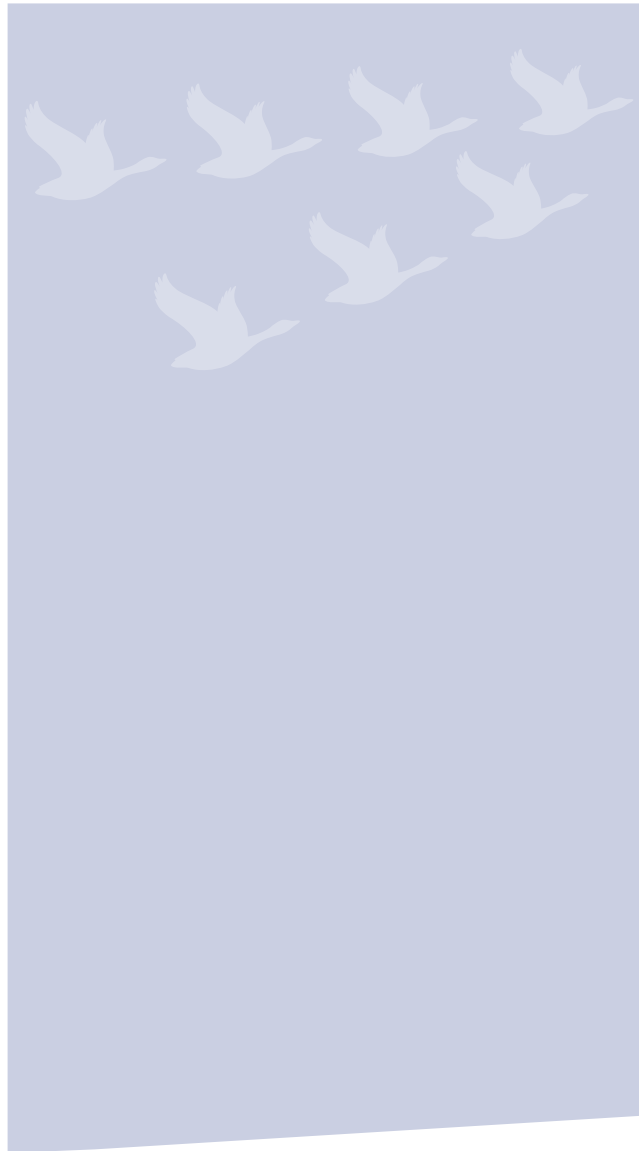

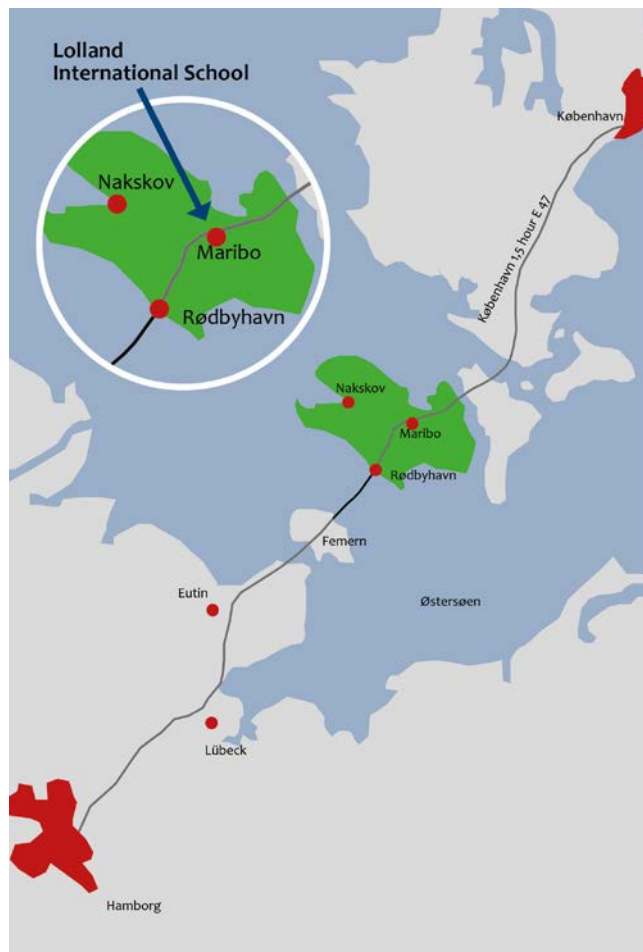
Welcome

Lolland International School is the first municipal, international school in Denmark. It is a free offer, where the students will follow a bilingual programme and be taught in an international environment.

We provide the best of the Cambridge International curriculum and the Danish national curriculum. Mathematics, Science and English are taught in English, whereas we teach the other subjects in Danish.

The bilingual approach will give the student strong linguistic skills, a global perspective, cultural sensitivity, and ample opportunities to continue further education in Denmark or abroad.

Students at Lolland International School will also encounter other cultures, for example among their classmates, there may be students from a large part of the world. A student with us thus becomes a world student in a global classroom.



Our location

The school is centrally located in the city of Maribo in Lolland, close to both highway and train connections.

Moreover, the school lies adjacent to Maribo Gymnasium and another public school, with ample opportunities for community and cooperation.

“The important thing for us is to become part of the local community and that our kids will be able to become part of that as well”.

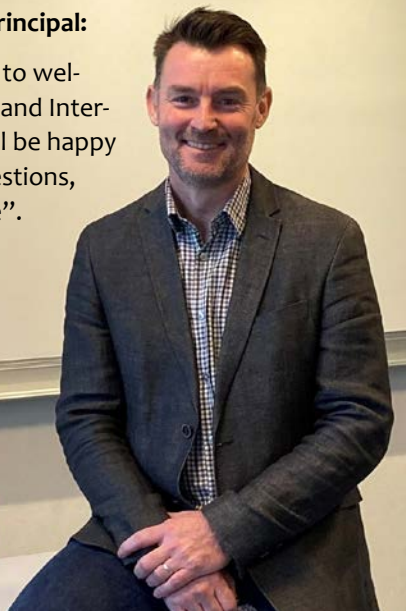
